Train excellent physicians in a rural environment, assist them in pursuing the medical career of their choosing, and provide them the opportunity to experience the rewards and challenges of medical practice in rural Kansas, hoping that many will choose to eventually practice in rural Kansas.

## FAST FACTS

- Salina campus opened in 2011
- 8-10 students admitted each year
- 90 matriculants to date (45 males, 45 females)
- 79 of 90 (88%) Kansas residents; 58 of 90 (64%) from rural communities (smaller than Salina)
- The ACE School of Medicine curriculum allows for increased clinical experiences starting Year 1
- Majority of clinical learning is one-on-one with a faculty physician
- As of May 2021, seven classes have graduated, and of the 55 graduates, 81% started a primary care residency; 19% are specializing
- From the 2015 - 2018 classes, over 63% have started practice in rural Kansas



## WHY SALINA ?

The Salina campus is designed for students with a strong interest in Rural Medicine, Primary Care, and providing medical services to rural Kansas. Students in Salina work with a smaller group of peers on a rural regional campus. Interprofessional activities and education occur in clinical settings.
